As we reach the end of the academic year I am very proud of the extent, level and quality of the services we have provided with children and families throughout these past three school terms. We recently discussed as a service those values that underpin all of the work we do under the umbrella of Aireborough Children's Services and it was a powerful reminder of the



commitment we continually make during increasingly pressured times; namely to treat people fairly, retain a sense of fun and humour in our work, ensure that we are respectful, deliver on what we promise and above all make a positive difference to people's wellbeing and lives. I feel confident and hopeful that this mirrors the experience of the majority of those accessing our supports and services, and where we have not been able to make a difference directly, we have delivered our best and perhaps directed or signposted onto other services or supports that can help.

We are continuing to try and offer different and better ways to respond to issues and challenges faced by families – currently we are delivering workshops for Parents of Adolescents that initial feedback is extremely positive about the relevance and need for this type of support and information.
